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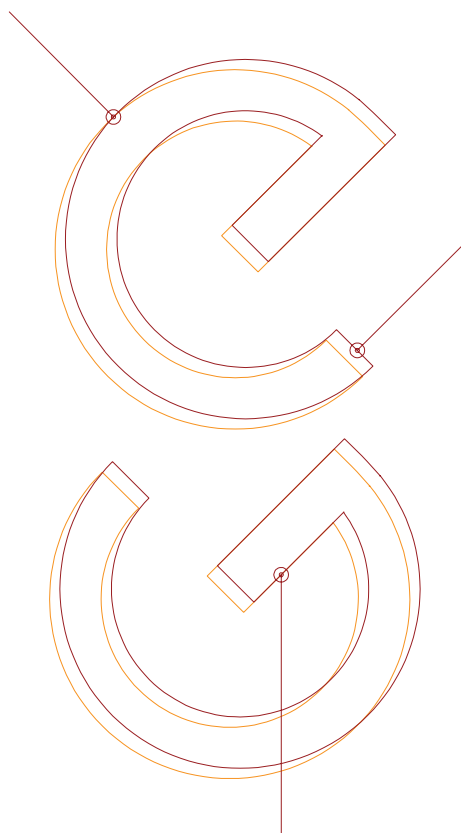

Electronic Governance aims at the strategic application of ICT for good governance. This involves efficiency and efficacy of government, enhanced public service delivery, increased transparency and accountability, and broader public participation in policy and democratic processes.

The Leadership School on Electronic Governance in Maldives is a one day programme targeted at public managers from the Government of Maldives with the aim of raising awareness and building capacity to lead Electronic Governance development in the country.

Specifically, the school will:

- present and discuss the context, concepts, benefits and challenges of Electronic Governance;
- discuss the roles and responsibilities of various levels of leadership in directing, developing and managing Electronic Governance;
- show how Electronic Governance can support government leaders in engaging citizens, businesses and the society at large in governance processes and public service delivery; and
- discuss the current status, on-going initiatives, coordination, and challenges for Electronic Governance development in the Maldives.

Dr. Tomasz Janowski is the founder and head of the Center for Electronic Governance at UNU-IIST, an international center of excellence in Electronic Governance, part of United Nations University Int. Institute for Software Technology (UNU-IIST), and Senior Research Fellow of UNU-IIST.

A researcher and practitioner in e-Governance with keen interest in ICT for development, Tomasz has led a number of research, development and capacity-building projects funded by Macao Foundation, Microsoft, UNDP, World Bank, etc., organized many capacity-building events in developing countries, and served as Program Committee member and chair at numerous international conferences

In particular, Tomasz Janowski:

- 1) Founded a series of International Conferences on Theory and Practice of Electronic Governance (ICEGOV - www.icegov.org),
- 2) Established an initiative to build a global Community of Practice for Electronic Governance (UNeGov.net),
- 3) Led a unique government program to build a foundation for Electronic Government in Macao (e-Macao - www.emacao.gov.mo),
- 4) Established a project framework EGOV.* to develop a strategy towards e-Governance in a given Public Administration (PA), establish a program to implement this strategy and build consensus and capacity in the PA to execute it.

His research interests include foundations and frameworks for sustainable Electronic Governance, tools and applications of formal engineering techniques, and rigorous development of enterprise systems, particularly systems for the public sector.

Governments are under pressure from citizens, businesses and civil society to address public needs, to support local industries, to deliver high-quality services at reasonable cost to the public, etc.

In response, they develop Electronic Governance - leverage the use of Information and Communication Technology to bring about customer orientation, business like management, new forms of public service delivery and other public sector reforms.

In doing so, government leaders face many challenges, such as:

- 1) Introducing the necessary structural and process changes to accompany technical solutions, against resistance to change.
- 2) Finding ways to cooperate on cross-agency projects, within traditionally hierarchical structures of government organizations.
- 3) Building long-lasting solutions for governments, while facing volatility of supporting technologies.
- 4) Relying on the private sector to deliver public services while keeping data secure and maintaining self-determination in technological choices.

UNeGov.net is an initiative of the United Nations University to build a global research and practice community on Electronic Government. A forum for studying and addressing such challenges, the community brings together researchers and practitioners from across national, thematic and sectoral borders, with common interest in transformational use of technology in government and beyond.
